

# President's Letter by Tammi L. Gagnon



My Name is Ogden. I love to snuggle and to stretch out on the floor.

Most of the individuals who will be reading this newsletter treat the cats and dogs in our life as part of the family. We believe that they are ours to love and cherish until they pass from this life. Unfortunately not every animal is that lucky. The shelter plays a vital role in making sure that pets find a new forever home. We see all types of dogs and cats of all ages, sizes and various backgrounds.

Let me introduce you to Ogden and Blueberry. They are a couple of old timers that I adopted from the shelter this last year. One look at these adorable pictures is all it takes to fall in love.

I want to tell their story to encourage the adoption of older cats and dogs from the shelter. Both of my boys were removed from their long time homes and left in a strange place. At approximately 9 years old they were classified as hard to adopt because of their age. Every year we see older cats and dogs surrendered and then they are left to compete with kittens and puppies to find a new home.

There is a wide variety of reasons for these older pets to be surrendered. It is often due to the health or death of their owner. By no fault of their own the older pet is removed from the home they have known for years and their longtime companion disappears. Next time you are in the shelter please consider adopting an older animal. Although the younger ones may be more curious and cute please remember that the older ones are scared, confused and just looking for a new best friend.

An older cat will not terrorize your house like a kitten will by climbing your curtains. Instead

they will sleep most of the day and welcome the opportunity to sit on your lap after you have a long day. In addition, many times they are already declawed and spayed or neutered unlike their younger competition. At the same time an older dog will welcome the opportunity to take a nap with you. They typically won't chew your slippers or potty inside the house like the creatures with puppy breath and are often spayed or neutered. The most important thing to them is to find a new individual to be a loyal companion to.

In our hectic lives we often think we don't have time to commit to a new pet. What we forget about is that the older cat will almost take care of themselves if you make sure there is food, water and a warm place to curl up for a good nap. If you are a dog lover, throw in a good backyard and a front door to wait for you to come home by. In closing I ask you to remember the following when you or someone you know is looking for a new pet. Kittens and puppies are fun but please don't rule out the love and companionship an older cat or dog will give you unconditionally.



# **Is Your Cat** a Floosie?

Obviously at this rate there are not homes for all of them and you can help stop these generations of suffering. Have your female spayed and your male neutered. Don't allow litters. We have a Spay the Mom Cat Program that will pay 100% of the spay cost. Stop by the Shelter or call us for an application. We would much rather help you get your floosie fixed than have unwanted litters with no homes. There are few qualifications to this program and most that apply qualify so check it out!

# **Top 5 Holiday Dangers to Pets**

The holidays are a festive time for us and our pets. It's a time to easily overlook potential dangers to our four-legged family members. Take preventive measures to protect your pets. Being aware of these top five dangers could save you a trip to the vet.

Holiday Tinsel and Ornaments – while not toxic, are very attractive to cats. Once it's consumed, it can cause serious injury to your pet. In addition, tree ornaments can attract your pet's curiosity. Place glass ornaments higher up on the tree.

Holiday Lighting and Candles – are another source of danger to your curious pets. Electrical shock may occur when a pet bites an electrical cord. If you have candles on display, place them out of reach of your pets so they don't burn themselves or create a fire.

**Gift Wrap Ribbon** – It's best to discard ribbons and

bows from gifts so that your pets won't be enticed to chew or swallow them. Ingested ribbon can cause problems leading to emergency surgery and even death.

Food Hazards – Festive events mean edible treats — and lots of them. Unfortunately, many holiday goodies, such as chocolate, bones and nuts, can be extremely toxic or fatal to pets. Fat trimmings and bones are dangerous for dogs. Certain nuts should not be given to pets.

**Toxic Holiday Plants** – may be pretty, but some holiday plants are poisonous—even deadly. As little as a single leaf from any lily variety is lethal to cats. Others to avoid are pine needles, holly, mistletoe and poinsettias.

Taking precautions with pets during these festive times can help ensure that you and your family will enjoy a happy — and healthy — holiday season!


### **HELP PETS LOCALLY**
