Another important method of donating to the shelter is through your estate planning. Various kinds of gifts can be left to the shelter through the use of a Will or trust. A gift to the shelter can be made without incurring inheritance or estate tax. In fact you may qualify for

a charitable deduction. Whether or not this deduction would be beneficial to you should be discussed with your attorney or CPA.

Gifts to the shelter can be a valuable tax planning tool. You will want to visit with your personal financial advisor to determine if an income tax deduction, an inheritance tax or estate tax deduction makes more sense. Where the deduction will be the most beneficial depends on your particular circumstances.

Regardless of how you decide to donate to the shelter, during your lifetime or at death, we have a couple of ways to recognize our supporters. Please visit our website to read about how you can be part of our memorial garden and our donors board.
