## **PRESIDENTS LETTER**

I cannot emphasize enough the importance of spaying and neutering your pets, especially cats. There are so many unplanned and unwanted litters of kittens out there and just not enough homes. If you can't afford to spay your female cat, reach out to the Siouxland Humane Society. We have a "spay the mom" program to get the job done at little or no cost to you. Please do the right thing. Below is an article I wrote when I fostered a litter of unwanted kittens that were discarded by people who didn't do the right thing. Please don't be these people.

## I AM ANGRY

I am angry. I am a foster parent to a litter of unwanted kittens and I am angry. I am angry that as I write this all I can hear are the constant screams of 3-week old kittens. I am angry that hearing these constant cries makes me want to run away. I am angry that these innocent creatures that so desperately need me are driving me crazy. And as I feel the tears roll down my face I realize that not only am I angry, I am sad.

I am angry that I can only be away from my house for 4 hours at a time because the kittens must eat at least that often. I am angry that last night during my 4 hours of freedom I had to choose between going to the wedding of two dear friends or meeting up with a friend in town from Phoenix. I haven't seen her in a very long time. I miss her a lot. I chose the wedding and the kittens. Always the kittens.

I am angry that my house stinks. I am tired of constantly cleaning and disinfecting everywhere the kittens go. I am sick of bathing kittens. I am angry that there is kitten poop everywhere. And I am angry that Murphy's Law dictates that I step in it every time!

I am angry that I have potentially put my own pets health at risk by bringing these sickly kittens into our house. And I am angry that I have to ration my time with them because everything that I have is put into keeping these kittens alive. And my patience with my healthy adult pets wears thin as I take care of these sickly baby kittens.

I am angry that my husband is angry. And I can't blame him. He didn't sign up for this. He didn't bring these kittens here. He doesn't want our house to smell like canned cat food and the litter box of sick kittens. Who in their right mind wants to live that way?

I am angry that the runt is not thriving. I am angry that despite my best efforts she is probably not going to

make it. She is tiny and sick and she needs her mom. Her real mom and her real mom's milk to help nurture her. As she sleeps on my lap now as I write this, she is becoming weaker and I realize that no matter how hard I try, I am a poor substitute.

I am angry that if I am successful and these kittens do make it I don't know what their future holds. There is nothing special about them. Two grey and black tabbies that look like any alley cat out there and one solid black. I worry the tabbies will be thrown out after the kitten cuteness wears off with their new owners. I worry someone could try to harm the black one, simply because of stupid superstitions. Like I said, they are nothing special to most people. But they are very special to me. I will give them all the love I have to give because I am all they have right now. And I will show them how special they really are.

But what makes me the most angry is that this all should not be happening. These kittens should never have been born into such an uncertain future. I am going through all of this because someone chose not to spay their cat. And that makes me angry, very angry. But not only were they irresponsible they were cruel. They took these innocent babies away from their mother way too young simply because they didn't want to be inconvenienced any further. And what makes my blood boil is that they will never know what I have gone through just to try to keep them alive! These kittens needed their mom and these people didn't care. And now the kittens and I will pay the price. As I look down on the runt still sleeping on my lap I am sad. She may wake up and she may not. But one thing is certain, if she doesn't make it she will not die alone. I will hold her and comfort her when the time comes. And she will know in her brief life that she was special and she was loved. By me.

The runt died in my arms shortly after I wrote this. Please spay and neuter your cats.

**GREAT ENDING:** Meet Teddy. This handsome boy was here for a long time. He went to a huge offsite adoption event – Clear the Shelters – and was the only one there that didn't get a home. The very next day this wonderful couple came to the shelter, looked at him first, visited with him, and fell in love and adopted him. ## **YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE**

The Siouxland Humane Society is the only nonprofit open admission full service animal welfare organization in Siouxland. While other organizations have a more limited yet valuable focus, our many programs and services serve the needs of the community that has so devotedly supported us over the years.

In 2018 the **Pet Food Bank** helped 221 families that could not afford to feed their pets during financial hardship. Over 4500 pounds of cat and dog food were given out this past year.

The Veterinary Assistance Program helped 79 families who otherwise could not afford to get their sick/injured pets seen by a veterinarian. We help pay initial veterinary examination costs up to \$50.00 per visit. We paid out \$4,367.75 to veterinarians for these services in 2018.

A much needed community service is **Spay/Neuter Assistance**. We helped hundreds of Siouxland families with spay/neuter costs in 2018. Financial assistance in the amount of \$29,851.69 was provided to the community with a primary focus on cat spay/neuter.

**Emergency Sheltering Services** provided temporary shelter for dozens of pets displaced due to house fires, natural disasters such as flooding or those needing safe haven while their owners reside in a domestic violence shelter.

These and our many other programs and services are vital to the Siouxland community.
