Finally, make sure to have proper id tag with your pet's name and phone number on your pet's collar just in case Fluffy or Fido slide out the front door. 

This is Lindsey's first year on the Board at the Humane Society. She says it is easy to fall in love with this shelter when the staff and volunteers share the same passion for ensuring animals are well cared for and loved. The amount of work and dedication that goes on behind the scenes to make the shelter run smoothly and efficiently is inspiring!
