

## DOGS PLAYING FOR LIFE: ENRICHING LIVES AND REDUCING STRESS

In the ever-changing world of animal sheltering, we are constantly on the lookout for new programs and services to make our shelter better, and of course that includes making a pet's stay at the shelter as less stressful as possible. With this in mind we began the process of creating an outdoor play area for the dogs in our care. We were fortunate enough to receive grants from Petco Love and the Gilchrist Foundation to begin building two fenced in areas complete with tire obstacles, doggie pools and a playhouse.

The stage was set, so to speak, and the dogs were ready to play. The last step was for all our staff to receive training from a nonprofit called Dogs Playing for Life (DPLF). DPFL is an organization rooted in the notion that a dog's natural instinct is to play and we are able to provide them that opportunity through dog playgroups. With the help of a grant from Animal Farm Foundation, we were able to hold a two-day seminar here at the shelter. Not only did all of our staff attend and a few of our volunteers, we also offered the seminar to other area shelters. Brenda and Wade from Noah's Hope Animal Rescue and two staff from Heartland Humane Society joined us for the training.

The DPFL instructors, Kodi Sadler and Willian Sadler, spent two days at the shelter working with our staff and the dogs in our care. Training began with a classroom presentation on the theory behind the play. Next, it was out to the play yard for a hands-on training session. Runners brought the dogs from the kennel to the yard and, at the instruction of the DPFL lead handler, move dogs from one area to another if the chemistry isn't working. During this process our staff and volunteers were taught how to assess dog behaviors to create doggy playgroups. We also learned how to implement playgroups on a regular basis and have continued to do so since training. This additional enrichment has been so beneficial to them. When the dogs attend playgroup, they are happier and less stressed. We are also able to learn more about each dog and how they interact with each other through playgroups, which helps us match them to the best home.

# **OPERATION SUNFLOWER BRINGS RAY OF HOPE**

Two of the Siouxland Humane Society staff members assisted with Operation Sunflower – the rescue of animals affected by Hurricane Ida. Greater Good airlifted pets to the Sioux Falls, SD airport for rescue efforts to begin. These pets had already been surrendered to hurricane shelters and adoptable. In disasters this is the first step, moving out adoptable pets to make room for those involved with the disaster. Shelters working together one paw at a time! That precious cargo contained 90 homeless pets, 15 of which came to our Shelter -9 dogs and 6 cats. They were greeted at the airport by two staff and met here at the Shelter by a dozen volunteers who took the dogs for walks and socialized with the kitties and got them all settled in to feel welcome. The best news to share is they all have been adopted and are enjoying a place that they now can call home.
