

Gorgeous one-of-a-kind quilts will be up for auction giving you the opportunity to help support the lives of Siouxland's homeless pets. This spectacular group of quilts includes wall hangings, table covers, baby quilts, lap quilts, twin, full and king size bed quilts both hand and machine quilted. There are a number of exceptional collector hand stitched antique quilts on the auction that are simply exquisite. All the quilts have been donated by generous pet lovers in our area. 

### **10 Things You Didn't Know About: SHS Adoption Program**

- In 2014 there were 1033 cats, 894 dogs and 174 1 other animals adopted. We found forever homes for 100% of the adoptable pets.
- 2 Besides the Siouxland tristate area pets were adopted to Missouri, North Dakota, Illinois, Alabama, Texas, Kansas and Florida.
- 3 Small animals adopted included rabbits, finches, ferrets, parakeets, cockatiels, hamsters, gerbils, rats, mice, guinea pigs, turtles and chickens.
- PetSmart adopted 126 cats and Petco adopted 47 4 cats from their adoption cat adoption centers last year. We are at PetSmart 6 months of the year with 10 cats onsite. Petco has 2 cats on site year round.
- 5 Offsite adoption events are held monthly at Petco, PetSmart and the Southern Hills Mall. These events netted new homes for 53 dogs.
- Adoptions include initial preventative vaccinations, 6 deworming, microchipping, free veterinarian health

examination, spay/neuter discount and an adoption packet/new parent guide.

- 7 You can check out the adoptable pets and other news and information on our website, Facebook, Twitter, YouTube and LinkedIn.
- 8 Cat and kitten adoptions include a pet carrier to take your new pet home and for use for your free veterinary health examination which comes with your adoption.
- 9 Over one-third of the pets adopted are already spayed/neutered. Part of your adoption fee is refunded to you on those that are not. We also have a spay/neuter assistance program for those that adopt from us.
- 10 We have a Senior Pet adoption program which provides special pets to Senior citizens. Select pets that are mature settled adults are the perfect companions for senior citizens. These pets are fully vetted before placement.

Sign up with Scotts Lawn Service and they will donate \$30 in your name when you mention the Siouxland Humane Society. They will provide you with Service a free lawn analysis and estimate. Give them a call today and help out the homeless pets at the Shelter.

# **Notification Spotlight** By Lynn Mikkelsen Posey

Kim is in agreement with the rest of the Slouxland community, that the SHS does an amazing job helping animals. She says "the staff members are so dedicated and the volunteers are wonderful as well!" As one of the caramel apple volunteers herself, Kim observes how astonished she is at the number of people who participate in the apple production and sales! In closing, Kim emphasizes "the one thing I can't express enough is to spay/ neuter your pets and keep adopting from the shelter and supporting our humane good works!" ### **Enforcement and Advocacy for Animals**

Todd Trobaugh said yes to becoming a SHS volunteer and began by doing what he does best- law enforcement. You see, Todd works for the Sheriff's office in Woodbury County. He was and is often quite troubled by reported animal abuse and neglect many times not being investigated to the fullest extent of the law. He says "this lack, I believe, is just mainly due to lack of enforcement training in this area." Todd carries out animal abuse/neglect investigations for three counties in the area. He also is a member of the board of directors at the shelter along with presenting K-9 demonstrations for volunteer events.

Todd has always had a bond with animals, especially dogs. His parents adopted a dog when Todd was 6 months old and she was his true friend all through school, living to be 18 years old. Following her compassionate euthanasia due to old age, Todd purchased a Vizla for bird hunting and trained another for the same purpose. He brought that passion to the Sheriff's office where he began training a Belgian Malinois to be a police dog. Rudy was a K-9 member of the Sheriff's office for 12 years and won numerous competitions and certifications at police dog trials. Todd boasts "Rudy, in fact, went to the national police dog trials where he placed third out of the best drug dogs in all of the United States." "Working with Rudy just grew my passion for animals even more." He enrolled to become a certified trainer for police dogs and honed his training practice in Jackson, Mississippi for a month. With several dogs at home, he enjoys spending time with and training them for this special work. Upon retirement from law enforcement, Todd has a goal of starting his own training facility for police dogs.

A staunch advocate for changing the laws for animal abuse/neglect and puppy mill breeders, he notes "the laws are weak for enforcement action and have little recourse for a violation of the abusers or bad breeders." Todd has written legislators in an attempt to strengthen these laws, but needs our help and the backing of the public and officials as well to make these changes a reality. Todd, your actions to improve the lives of abused and neglected animals on all levels is greatly appreciated!

# **VET CORNER**

Hello from Family Pet Hospital (formerly Roach Animal Hospital)! I'm sure everybody is looking

forward to some warmer weather in the near future, but with the changing seasons there are a few things to think about in regards to your family pet's health and well-being.

- Heartworms are transmitted by mosquito bites. Did you know that an adult heartworm can grow to 12-24 inches in length! Yuck! They can cause quite a bit of damage to a dog's heart and lungs. Most heartworm preventives are given once monthly and come in topical or oral formulations. Follow your vet's recommendation on regular heartworm testing to ensure the product is working and your pet is protected.
- Fleas and ticks will be out in full force soon. We've been seeing a few pets with fleas already this spring! Even indoor-only pets and dogs that only go outside briefly to potty can get fleas. Many wild animals (like rabbits, squirrels, raccoons) carry fleas, so fleas are common in grassy areas and you can carry them inside to your pet on your socks or pant legs. We recommend monthly topical or oral preventives – they work better than dips or collars. If your pet gets fleas, you will need to treat your home as well because fleas spend more time off of the pet (i.e. in your house!) than on the pet.
- Microchipping can be a great way to ensure your pet is returned to you if he is ever lost.
   Microchips don't have GPS tracking capabilities, but rather the chip is coded a unique number (like a barcode) that can be linked through the company's database to your name and contact info. Make sure to keep your contact info up to date and have your pet's microchip scanned once yearly to make sure it's still working properly.
- Heat stroke can be a life threatening condition. Start slowly with any outdoor physical activity with your pet and gradually work your way up. Make sure to take plenty of breaks in the shade and provide your pet with plenty of fresh, cool water.

Many pharmaceutical companies will have coupons, rebates, or specials on flea/tick and heartworm preventives. Call your vet's office to see what offers are available. We hope you have a safe, enjoyable summer!


