This spectacular group of quilts includes wall hangings, baby, lap and full size quilts, both hand and machine quilted. There are a number of exceptional pet themed and antique quilts on the auction that are simply exquisite. All the quilts have been donated by generous pet lovers in our area. ANIMAL SHELTER TIDBITS

Terms like "humane society" or "SPCA" are generic. Shelters that use those names are not part of the ASPCA or The Humane Society of the United States. Currently no government agency or animal organization tabulates animal statistics, nor is there a specific way all shelters count and report their statistics. Here are some estimates which vary from shelter to shelter and state to state.

- Approximately 6.5 million companion animals enter U.S. shelters every year. Of those, approximately 3.3 million are dogs and 3.2 million are cats. This is a decline from about 7.2 million in 2011. The biggest decline was in dogs.
- Each year, approximately 1.5 million shelter animals are euthanized (670,000 dogs and 860,000 cats). This has declined from approximately 2.6 million in 2011.

- Approximately 3.2 million shelter pets are adopted each year (1.6 million dogs and 1.6 million cats).
- About 710,000 animals that enter shelters as strays are returned to their owners. Of those, 620,000 are dogs and only 90,000 are cats.
- 34% of dogs are purchased from breeders, while only 23% of dogs and 31% of cats are obtained from an animal shelter or humane society.
- Results show the top seven reasons both dogs and cats are surrendered to shelters are the same. The leading reasons are moving, landlord not allowing pets, too many animals in household and cost of pet maintenance.

TOO HOT FOR SPOT?

"It's hot!" you say to yourself, while you sit in the shade and sip a cold beverage while your dog looks at you pleadingly. Clearly your dog is hot and you realize their discomfort too. What can you do that will make them comfortable and protected from heatstroke?

- 1. Find some shade A large tree, a small patio area where you can create a canopy or a collapsible shade tent can be folded and unfolded as needed.
- 2. Take a dip, but be careful Check out the pool or lake, jump in with your dog. Enter the water slowly with just his feet in the cold water for a bit. A small child's wading pool can be placed even in your yard or patio to allow your dog to simply stand in the water.
- 3. Create a breeze Make summer heat much more tolerable by placing a window or box fan on the patio and create a great breeze for your dog.
- 4. Try some mist Obviously a garden hose to wet your dog will help, but it wastes water and some dogs are afraid of the hose. Instead consider using a mist attachment that sprays a fine mist of water. These are available at home improvement centers and need not be expensive.

- 5. Use a wet blanket A hand or bath towel that has been dampened and kept in the freezer is a great aid for cooling. A bag of frozen peas can be used to cool your dog's head, or placed on the neck or groin where some big blood vessels live.
- 6. Ice that drink On a hot day, you take a cool drink, share with your dog. Keep their water fresh and cool and replenish it often. You can add ice to the water bowl to help lower the temperature.
- 7. Make popsicles and icicles Share a popsicle or frozen juice bar, but make sure it doesn't contain a toxic sweetener. If your dog doesn't like fruit flavors consider making frozen bars with plain water and a touch of beef bouillon.
- 8. Always carry water Make sure that when you leave home, you carry plenty of water for your dog. A quart of bottled water can easily be frozen and kept cool in an insulated bag.

If it's too hot for you it's too hot for your pet. Some days are best spent indoors by an air conditioner. If your dog shows signs of overheating or you have any concerns take him to your veterinarian immediately. Have a safe and fun summer!
