member can do to have a happy and safe sun-filled season. On hot days leave your pet inside with the air conditioning and if your dogs must stay outside make sure your pet has access to shade and water. While Fido jumps for the opportunity to go for a joy ride, leaving any pet alone in a parked car during the warm weather can be deadly. Temperatures in a vehicle can rise rapidly to dangerous levels. On a day that is 85, inside your car with the windows cracked open, temperatures can reach 102 degrees within just 10 minutes. So leave Fido at home! Go for walks in the early morning or late evenings, hot pavement can burn the pads of your pet's paws. The best place for your pet to be during the heat is inside with you, keeping cool! 

Our staff and volunteers are doing amazing work in this area! Some exciting things we have undertaken are to update and renew several areas of the Shelter.

The cats and kittens are getting lots of attention. Another brand new multiple cat/kitten condo is in the works. This will bring us up to three cat condos where multiple cats can reside, giving us more space to keep bonded buddies and litters of kittens together! We are also doing an overhaul of the oldest existing cat condo installing new climbing ledges and perches.

Equipment to do a better job of washing and disinfecting of the bowls and toys and new solid surface countertops have been installed to help with cleanliness, sanitation and spread of disease.
