
PETS ON

Join us for the 18th annual Pets on Parade event on Saturday, September 19th at Riverside Park Shelter #1 in Sioux City. This is a pledged Walk/Run with the timed run starting prior to the walk. Those not competing in the 5k can join us for a 1-mile walk; participate with or without a pet. Don't have a pet but would like to walk one, take one of our shelter pets that's available for adoption! They would love the exercise and companionship while waiting for a forever home.

We encourage you to form or join a team, ask family, friends and coworkers to join you. The more money raised, the better the prizes and the more you help homeless pets in Siouxland! As an individual you need to raise a minimum of \$30.00 in pledges, to participate as a team/dog pack; your group has to raise a minimum of \$300.00. Packs get the same prizes as individuals with additional gifts for being in a pack. The Top Fundraisers for 18 and under and for 18 and over will win a \$100.00 gift card each. The Top Team/Dog Pack will win a Pizza Party! Make it a family affair; there is no age limit on participation.

After the run/walk, pet contests, vendor booths, music and a silent auction will be going on. These will all be well spread out for social distancing. Encourage your supporters, family and friends to come cheer you on! You can still raise funds and get pledges even if you do not want to run or walk, do it for the animals, they rely on your support. From the desk of...Jerry Dominicak, Executive Director

A quarter of a century, 25 years, both sound like a very long time. August 14, 1995 was my first day with the Siouxland Humane Society. Looking back, I sometimes think it's been a long 25 years, other times, I think time has flown by when you are doing something you love!

Reminiscing with those that were around in the beginning really makes one realize how far we have come in a relatively short amount of time. Kelly, now Public Relations and Volunteer Manager and a handful of volunteers have been with us this whole time. I remember my first day – I met the then Board President at the Shelter. We walked in and I was given a key to the Shelter, introduced to Kelly and was told to call if I had any questions. Kelly has been a rock and I owe her a lot of credit for helping me along and sticking with us all this time!

In August 1995 we had a budget deep in the red, a dilapidated building and a 50 % adoption rate. After a couple months I was ready to quit. There was dissention amongst the Board, and staff and volunteers were not happy. It seemed no one wanted change, and believe me there were lots of changes being made! I will forever be indebted to Dr. Richard Robinson, who visited or called daily and stood beside me with advice and support. Without him I can honestly say I would have been gone.

Turn the corner, huge successes - less than 4 years later, spring of 1999, we had raised over a million

dollars and had built and moved into our current new state of the art building. In 2013 we expanded the Shelter with much needed program and service space. After 21 years most visitors still think the Shelter looks brand new. Our adoption numbers have soared – we place 100% of the adoptable pets. Our programs and services have flourished, growing by leaps and bounds, letting us help more abused, neglected homeless pets and helping people and pets stay together as families. Our volunteer program boosts over 700 active volunteers, which makes executing all our expanded programs and services possible.

As the saying goes – "It takes a village", I have to credit our successes to some very important people. First, I have the BEST staff and support group anyone could hope for. Together we are a team that I think is unbeatable! Volunteers amaze me with what they do and how much they accomplish and contribute to our successes! The Board of Directors contribute so much, are always there to offer guidance and support and let us explore some ideas that sometimes may be a bit out of the box. Lastly, a huge part of our many successes are due to you.

I am especially thankful for all of you who contribute financially to make all these wonderful things happen for the homeless, neglected and often abused animals!

I am employed at Royal Canin, Veterinarian canning pet food facility in NSC, and have been since August 21, 1989. I have served on the board the past few years with many other organizations throughout the Siouxland area.

We are all facing a difficult time right now, the dreaded Covid, and I would like to discuss how pets help people through such a difficult time, no matter what it may be. Pets are such great comfort and there's no question, pets offer more than just a slobbery greeting, they bring joy and comfort through these tough times, or any time.

When faced with challenges in life, you can turn to your pet for far more than companionship, you can turn to them to help reduce stress, anxiety, depression, and to give you hope. Check out these ways your pet can help you, and hopefully one, or all can help you in some way.

1. **Talk to your pet,** whatever it is, dog, cat, horse, rabbit, hamster, etc. Many pets pick up on emotions and sense stress or sadness. They are great listeners - no unwelcome advice given - and sometimes, saying things aloud offers relief or help you work through troubling thoughts.

2. Look to your pet for comedy relief. Pets are funny, often without any effort at all. Whether chasing their tail (or each other if more than two pets in your home), hiding toys, falling off their exercise wheel, swimming in circles or fetching. Pets are often good for at least a smile, chuckle or laugh, and this is an excellent way to relieve stress.
