UNIQUE "FOSTER HOME"

Prince was with us for months and we could not find him a suitable home because of his energy level. Through one of our many rescue program partners, Rescued Tails Animal Sanctuary, he was placed in a "foster home" at the Minnesota Correctional Facility in Rush City. He is now part of the Rush to Rescue prison foster dog program.

Prince lives with offenders and, like a home environment, goes with the schedule of the team he lives with. During the day support members 'dog sit' if a team is working. A certified trainer goes to the prison to hold obedience classes and the inmates work on the commands daily. During training the trainer also discusses any issues and progress. The inmates take Prince to fenced fields for training and play time with the other dogs in the program. Some have tasks that take them to other parts of the facility and Prince goes right along. He also joins his handlers in evening activities.

The prison dogs go on a rotating basis to adoption events and fundraisers. If an approved applicant is interested in meeting Prince or another dog, they do it in the prison lobby. The program has lots of benefits. It has increased positive interactions between offenders and staff and makes the prison environment less stressful. Of course, it also helps save more dogs lives.




Prince takes center stage with one of his team handlers. His training is progressing and he is becoming an adoptable happy dog!

She became aware of the Humane Society and in May joined the Board of Directors. Debbie notes "I am grateful for the opportunity to have a positive impact on Siouxland's animal community. For me, it is a way of giving back to all the wonderful four legged companions who have enriched my life over the years."

From the desk of... Jerry Dominicak, Executive Director

As I write this, we have just finished our fiscal year that ended December 31, 2015. What struck me most in reviewing our accomplishments is how much success we've continued to have with our programs and services. The impact they have had on improving the quality of life for the people and pets in Siouxland is more than most of us could have imagined.

Through our **Adoption/Surrender Program** we have seen our placement rate stay at 100% of the adoptable pets finding forever new homes. This is a great achievement considering we are an open admission shelter! The **Breed Rescue Program** is credited greatly for this success placing over 200 pets with other organizations this past year. We know it will take continued focus and dedication to continue, but we are dedicated to doing so.

Our **Spay/Neuter Assistance Program** has assisted hundreds of people in getting their pets fixed. This program has helped many animals including shelter adopted dogs and cats, non-shelter adopted cats and our Spay the Mom Cat Program. In 2015 our **Spay the Mom Cat Program** received a lot of attention and justifiably so – it is a key component to getting the cat overpopulation problem under control.

When people fall upon hard times and occasionally need a little help, we are there for them. The **Pet Food Bank** for example, is one service that we provide to help keep families and pets together. **Veterinary** Assistance and Emergency Sheltering are others which help provide a way for families to keep their pets.

The **Sponsor a Pet Program** is designed to help specific pets have a better chance at adoption, pets that in years past might never have reached the adoption floor. Your donations to cover part or the entire adoption fee, vet expenses or spay/neuter surgery have helped save countless pets.

While they may not get the notice some of the others do additional programs and services are absolutely essential in helping us realize our mission. They include programs such as the Senior Pet Program, Education Programs, Volunteer, Pet Facilitated Therapy and Cruelty/Neglect Investigations. Services also offered include End of Life Services, Lost & Found, Microchipping, Pet Supplies and Pet Wish List.

Your continuing support along with the dedication of our staff, volunteers and board of directors is crucial as we continue to help the people and pets in Siouxland. 10 Things You Didn't Know About: SHS Adoption Program

- 1 In 2015 there were 1045 cats, 766 dogs and 158 other animals adopted. We found forever homes for 100% of the adoptable pets.
- 2 Besides the Siouxland tristate area pets were adopted to Missouri, North Dakota, Illinois, Alabama, Texas, Kansas and Florida.
- 3 Small animals adopted included rabbits, finches, ferrets, parakeets, cockatiels, hamsters, gerbils, rats, mice, guinea pigs, turtles and chickens.
- 4 Our Rescue program found homes for 153 cats, 33 dogs and 45 other animals in 2015. This helps us continue our 100% placement.
- 5 Offsite adoption events are held monthly at Petco, PetSmart and the Southern Hills Mall. Other offsite adoption events are held at area businesses and events as well.
- 6 Adoptions include initial preventative vaccinations, deworming, microchipping, free veterinarian health examination, spay/neuter

discount and an adoption packet/new parent guide.

- 7 You can check out the adoptable pets and other news and information on our website, Facebook, Twitter, YouTube and LinkedIn.
- 8 Cat and kitten adoptions include a pet carrier to take your new pet home and for use for your free veterinary health examination which comes with your adoption.
- 9 Over one-third of the pets adopted are already spayed/neutered. Part of your adoption fee is refunded to you on those that are not. We also have a spay/neuter assistance program for those that adopt from us.
- 10 We have a Senior Pet adoption program which provides special pets to Senior citizens. Select pets that are mature settled adults are the perfect companions for senior citizens. These pets are fully vetted before placement.
