More and more people are turning to the internet to search for a new pet. This results in increased opportunities for scammers looking for an easy buck. According to the BBB, fraud in the sale of online pets is on the rise, with scammers victimizing American consumers at an alarming rate. Many of these scams begin with a fake website or social media post utilizing stolen photos – often taken from a legitimate site. Once scammers receive an initial payment, additional fees are requested for things like shipping, special crates, or medical care. But the animal never arrives – because it never existed. The BBB urges the public to be on the guard against online scams, inspect the animal in person before paying any money, and pay by credit card if you do make an online purchase. Better yet adopt locally!
