DID YOU KNOW?

The majority of animal shelter workers leave the industry in 2 ½ years or less due to stress related and other factors. Currently our staff of 19 boast a combined 157 years of caring for the animals in Siouxland. This is an 8.26-year average. Three have been with us between 21 to 29 years and many are in the teens. Daily I applaud the hard work of this outstanding group of caregivers!

In 2021 over 7500 pounds of cat and dog food were given out to hundreds of people, pets – families that short term could not afford to feed their pets. Additionally, small area shelters/rescue were given food to help with their needs too.

LOVE FOR ANIMALS FROM THE VERY START

Kathryn Sitzmann got involved with the SHS after moving from California to Sioux City in 1998. She had been involved with shelters and rescues since she was old enough to volunteer. She has been rescuing animals since she was old enough to walk to school.

Kathryn had served on the SHS Board. She volunteers for outreach events, fundraisers and fosters mother dogs with puppies. She has been taking care of litters since she bought her house 17 years ago. Kat especially enjoys fostering and taking animals to offsites for adoption events.

She is an English, Second Language Teacher here in Sioux City. Before that she taught 5th thru 8th grade in

Kat wishes the SHS continued success in placing all adoptable pets in homes. Their hard work and dedication make a huge difference for the animals in their care and our community.

Tracy Boever got involved with the shelter when approached by board member Terri Kjeldseth. Terri knew of her love of animals, especially dogs! Tracy has done volunteer work in the past and feels it important to be a contributing member to the community but had never volunteered at the Humane Society previously. Tracy always had pets growing up and in adulthood. Her dad raised German Shorthairs and field trialed them so dogs have always been a part of her life.

Tracy is a member of the SHS Board and on the Executive Committee. Her background is in marketing and PR so any social media she loves. She truly had no idea about all the Humane Society programs and services until she became a Board Member. Tracy likes to be an advocate of the additional services that the HS performs above and beyond adopting pets.

From the desk of...Jerry Dominicak, Executive Director

Greetings! Quite a bit has been happening around the shelter since our last newsletter.

Pets on Parade was held in September and was a great success and lots of fun. We also brought back the Quilt Auction as many had asked about it. What a fun evening with so many nice quilts all donated by animal loving friends. Also, we will be having a fun-raiser at Iowa Barbeque Company on October 29th. Missie, Kelly and staff have been quite busy!

In addition to fundraising events, we rely heavily on donations that come throughout the year. We appreciate you thinking of the homeless pets! Recently we have purchased more enrichment toys, treats and beds for the cats and dogs to make their stay more comfortable. Without your help this would not be possible.

We've had a big fall with events. We participated in ArtSplash and the Multicultural Fair. We held several offsite adoption events. We visit Petco, PetSmart and the Southern Hills Mall each month. We also visited the Explorers, Fleet Farm and a couple other small businesses. This promotes the Shelter in the community



and finds forever homes for the homeless pets.

So far in 2022 we have adopted out 451 cats, 863 dogs and 187 other animals maintaining our 100% placement rate. We are on a roll but there are always more animals to help. Since our last newsletter we have had 3 abuse/neglect cases. Two cat hoarding cases, one in Charter Oak and one in Sac City and most recently a dog neglect case near Vermillion. These end up consuming lots of time and money. Thanks to great partners in our Tri-State Cooperative Coalition we didn't tackle these alone. A huge kudos to staff for the extra work they do when these come up!

On a lighter note we had several groups that we visited and several that came to the shelter for educational programs. We take great pride in our staff so we invest in animal welfare education for them. Recently we closed for a day and had a great seminar by Tierney Sein with Best Friends Animal Society. She talked about dog – relationship building, assessments, handling, foster, enrichment, dog to dog play and behavioral modification. Several other shelters/rescues also attended.



DID YOU KNOW?

Our Spay/Neuter Assistance Program has paid through September of this year \$20,409.23 in assistance to help S/N pets in Siouxland. Our Spay the Mom Cat program pays 100% of the spay costs.

Did Mou KNOW?

Since 2014 we have rehomed 100% of the adoptable pets! Shelters placing over 90% may use the terminology of "no kill". The official reporting standards and live release rate qualifications have been set by our peers in the industry who are from all over the country. In 2021 we were not able to save 11 animals out of the 2077 that were brought to our shelter. Of the 11, some were extreme medical cases in which we sought evaluation and advice from a veterinarian and euthanasia was recommended. Others were extremely aggressive biters with a high chance of reoccurrence. The risk for injury to people and other animals was too great. Under the current "no kill" guidelines, the Siouxland Humane Society and comparable size shelters having euthanasia numbers of 200 or less would be put in the no kill category. We are proud to far surpass the standard in that statistic. We go the extra mile to excel and exceed expectations and will continue to do the outstanding job we do saving pets lives. We want to save them all!
