Several area veterinarians donate their time to come to the shelter weekly to do rabies vaccines, health checks and treat sick/injured animals. Even with all the free vet care and assistance we spent \$26,523.51 in 2022 to treat sick or injured animals in our care.

We also assisted non-shelter adopted spay/neuter surgeries for those with a financial need in the amount of \$22,094.27.



Fact: Only 15% of dogs and 2% of cats in shelters without ID tags or a microchip are reunited with their owners.
