### **COMMON MYTHS**

Animal welfare is surrounded by misconceptions that lead to confusion about how best to care for pets or understand how shelters work. Here are a few common myths and the reality behind them.

### Myth: Humane Societies Are All Associated, Government-Funded, and/or Can Take in Any Animal

**Reality:** Many people assume humane societies are government-funded and part of a national organization, but this is often not the case. For example, we operate independently, solely relying on community donations. Additionally, we are unable to accept stray animals from Sioux City and other cities/counties with animal control services due to their rules and regulations. Stray animals must be reported to the animal control facility in the jurisdiction where they were found. This gives owners a singular location to check for their lost pets.

### Myth: A Dog's Behavior in the Shelter Always Reflects Its True Personality

**Reality:** The shelter environment can be overwhelming, leading to behaviors that might not represent their true nature. Noise, strange surroundings, and other animals can cause dogs to feel stressed or overexcited. Once in a calm, stable home, most dogs become more relaxed

and affectionate. This is why it's important not to judge a dog solely based on its shelter behavior.

### Myth: Indoor Cats Don't Need Vaccines or Flea Prevention

**Reality:** Cats living indoors benefit from vaccinations and flea prevention. Although they may not be exposed to other animals, viruses and parasites can still enter the home on shoes, clothing, or through windows. Diseases can be prevented with vaccines and fleas can be an issue even for indoor cats, especially if there are other pets in the home.

### Myth: A Dog's Breed Determines Its Behavior

**Reality:** While breed can give general insights into a dog's temperament or energy level, it's not a definite predictor of behavior. Many factors, including upbringing, environment, and individual personality, play

a significant role as well. So, it's important to evaluate dogs on an individual basis rather than relying solely on breed stereotypes.

# NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED WITH YOUR SUPPORT WE THRIVED



The Siouxland Humane Society (SHS) has received national recognition for our live release rate from the Best Friends Animal Society! A plaque was awarded for 2023, naming the SHS a no-kill shelter.

The SHS achieved an official save rate of 98.90% by Best Friends for 2023, far exceeding the national average of 82.60%. We were the only shelter/rescue in the area recognized in 2023. We have been a no-kill Shelter since 2014 with save rates exceeding 90% annually.

This accomplishment represents so much more than a number. It represents our culture of caring and compassion. Dedicated staff and board, committed volunteers and motivated supporters. This number represents cherished family members who are only alive because of our community's work, dedication and support.

Best Friends is dedicated to helping every shelter and every community become no-kill by 2025.



### PROTECT YOUR PET DURING THE HOLIDAYS

- 1. Keep people food away from your furry legged friends.
- 2. Keep candles and open flames out of reach.
- 3. Avoid using water additives with real trees.
- 4. Fence off areas of decoration or trees if you have curious pets.
- 5. Use shatter-proof decorations to help prevent injury.
- 6. Consider using plastic plants instead of real ones.

- 7. Place lights and electrical cords where pets cannot chew on them.
- 8. Provide a quiet, safe area for pets to get away from stressful activity.
- 9. Never force your pet to interact with other guests or animals.
- 10. Microchipped pets return home more often if they get loose during the holiday.
- 11. Take out trash with food or decorations as soon as possible to avoid ingestion.










### **PRESIDENTS LETTER**

Well, each quarter I am tasked with writing a short blog for this newsletter. Sometimes the blog is easier to write for me then other times because the shelter has some kind of an event going on that I can talk about... sometimes it's a bit tougher. This time around I want to talk about my Ella! Ella is a lab straight from the Siouxland Humane Society. She has been with my family now for almost 7 years. If you didn't know, I work for KG95 and each week the shelter would bring a puppy into the radio station for us to talk about on the radio in hopes someone like you would adopt them. Well, this puppy came in and just loved all over me... wouldn't stop licking and jumping around, tail wagging nonstop... just something special about her, I just knew she was coming home with me. I brought her home, introduced her to the rest of the pack and she fit right in. She has been so good with our kiddos not having any issues when they would jump around and fall into her, pull her ears or tug on her tail. Well, Ella started limping a month or so ago and after a visit to the vet was diagnosed with Osteosarcoma, a big word... bone cancer. I have been through this before with another one of my pups, so I know how the next couple months will play out. Dogs definitely do not live long enough but the time you get with them has so many benefits from improved moods, better social interactions,

companionship, even better health if you get out and go with them. I share this story with you for a few reasons... Pay attention to your animals, any kind of limping or them just not being themselves should be a sign for you to get them into a vet to be checked out, especially as they age. When that day comes you be with them, you lay with them while they take that step to their next journey, and you be there for them with all the love you can give them.

Enjoy the fall weather and take your dogs out for a walk or run, enjoy them, their time with us is too short... Rob













Plus, this time next year I have something exciting going on, I am getting married! I can't believe time has flown by this quickly! Paws 'N Claus is on the way and last year it was my favorite event! I got to say hi to so many pets and their families and it was so much fun talking with everyone! I can't wait to get my rowdy bunch back this year to get another session done! I hope to see you all there. Can you believe it... after Paws N' Claus, apples are right around the corner.....!

### DID YOU KNOW?

Our programs and services make a difference. In the first nine months of 2024 –

- Veterinary Assistance Has helped 111 families keep their pets by helping with vet bills totaling \$16,264.78.
- Spay/Neuter Assistance Has paid out for privately acquired pets \$17,306.65 to help with costs for families in Siouxland needing help.
- Pet Food & Supply Bank Has helped 418 families feed their pets by providing over 7500 lbs. of food, cat litter and supplies.
- So far, we have spent \$30,867.79 on pets surrendered to our care for veterinary care and services to make them healthy, happy and adoptable.
- These are just three of our many programs and services we offer the Siouxland community. With your support we can help so many people, pets – families stay together and keep pets out of area shelters/rescues.



### TRAIN THE STAFF, TRAIN THE DOGS!

Staff loves to learn and lets us know areas they would like to be more knowledgeable in. We love to provide them with training whenever we can. A win-win, particularly when the big winners are the animals! Staff had mentioned some time ago more and more of the untrained, out of control, hard to handle dogs getting surrendered to the shelter. As a group we visited and they decided that we should start with some basic obedience training as a refresher, and then move

on to more of the behavioral training problems. We are nearing the end of an 8 week course here at the Shelter with a professional dog trainer coming in every week to work with the staff and help them train the dogs. Staff has learned so much and has really enjoyed the time they spend training. After each class they then implement what they have learned with the dogs in shelter daily. You can often find them out back with their favorite dog working on training and manners.


