
So Much To Do, So little Time!

We take immense pride in our hardworking, dedicated, and professional staff. Our team consists of 19 members—10 full-time and 9 part-time—who are committed to providing the best care possible. Among them, our 8 management staff bring a combined 135 years of experience working at the shelter, with most having been here between 11 and 31 years. Including all staff members, we collectively hold an impressive 180 years of experience in animal welfare, averaging 9.5 years per person. This far surpasses the national retention average of 2.5 years for animal welfare professionals.

Despite the limited time available, we accomplish a great deal. Typically, we schedule between 74 to 80 hours daily, and average 520 to 580 hours per week. These hours encompass everything from daily in-shelter animal care and customer service to program administration, shelter management, fundraising, and volunteer and public

relations management. One common misconception about our closed day, Monday, is that we're not working. In reality, Mondays are among our busiest days. Monday we normally schedule more hours than days we are open. They are dedicated to deep cleaning, providing additional TLC for the animals, and completing essential management tasks without interruptions.

Most days, our team operates like a well-oiled machine. Thanks to the longevity of our staff, their ongoing education, and their genuine care for animals, we excel at what we do—finding forever-loving homes for the animals in our care. Everyone contributes and supports one another, making us a strong and knowledgeable team. We are incredibly proud of and grateful for our amazing staff. If you haven't visited us recently, we invite you to stop by, take a look around, and meet the people who make it all happen!



PRESIDENTS LETTER

I hope you had a fabulous Holiday Season and you are off to a great start here in 2025. I want to take a moment to remind everyone that the Siouxland Humane Society doesn't get national or state funding on the regular. From time to time, we get a grant but otherwise the shelter fundraises and is supported mainly by the support of great folks here in Siouxland! With that said, it is once again time for our biggest fundraiser of the year and an opportunity for you to help the shelter all while taking advantage of our delicious gourmet apples! FOR THE LOVE OF PETS


In 2024, we continued to explore ways to help our staff succeed and enhance our care for the animals entrusted to us for rehoming.

Our staff requested additional training in several areas, with a major focus on dog play groups. New staff underwent training in moderating these groups, while experienced staff participated in advanced technique courses. Additionally, all staff completed an 8-week obedience training program. Other training sessions included management and staff workshops on relationship building, customer service, and stress management.

Dog play groups remain a highlight for both dogs and staff. This past year, we updated and upgraded our playgroup tools and equipment, ensuring these sessions continue to run smoothly. Playgroups are held four to five times a week, and you can check out videos and highlights on our Facebook page.

We also concentrated on enrichment and equipment updates for both cats and dogs. We purchased new scales for weighing pets, leashes, collars, training treats, enrichment toys, and grooming tools. Our goal is to make the pets' lives as comfortable and stress-free as possible while they are in our care.

Additionally, we installed security cameras throughout the building. Along with our alarm system,





these cameras enhance the safety of pets when we're not on-site and allow us to monitor the well-being of pets, staff, volunteers, and guests during business hours. We also upgraded our computer system to improve efficiency.

After 25 years, it was time to reinvest in some of our mechanical systems. This year, we repaired or replaced the furnace, duct heater, condensing unit, air handler, and water heater. Thanks to annual maintenance contracts and the diligent care of our maintenance person, we were able to extend the lifespan of this equipment significantly.

FAQ....

What national organization regulates or governs you? When I see commercials on TV of abused animals and send money to national animal welfare organizations, it is being directed to my local humane society, right? These are questions we often hear and want to clarify for our many animal loving friends and supporters.

The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) and other national animal welfare organizations are all separate organizations unrelated to the Siouxland Humane Society (SHS). The SHS is not an umbrella organization or local chapter of any national animal welfare organization nor are we governed, ruled or regulated by them.

The SHS has a local Board of Directors and is governed by our own articles of incorporation, bylaws, mission statement and philosophy. Our focus is the adoption of companion animals to the general public through the operation of a local shelter. The SHS provides programs and services to the community to help keep people, pets and families together. Funding for these services is largely reliant on donations from the public.

We are not financially supported by the HSUS or any other animal welfare association, nor do we financially support them. The SHS is an independent private 501c3 non-profit organization. Any contribution you make please make directly to the SHS to support us here locally. Your support is appreciated in helping us continue to save the lives of the homeless, abandoned and neglected animals in Siouxland.

The Shelter features a well-stocked pet retail area offering a variety of essential items. 
